

Foreword

Your Excellencies who honour us of participating, Dear MediLabSecure partners, and contributors,

On behalf on the MediLabSecure consortium, it is our great pleasure to welcome you to this 3-day onsite meeting within, and for the Middle East Region.

Following the COVID-19 pandemic, there have been several scientific calls for the world to be better prepared for the next pandemic. Indeed, COVID-19 highlighted the need for a sustainable approach to surveillance and response to public health threats. Therefore, the successful implementation of a «One Health» approach seems crucial more than ever to enable an effective coordination between all national health sectors involved in prevention and preparedness activities.

As a strong advocate of One Health, the MediLabSecure consortium organises this Middle East regional meeting dedicated to the detection of emerging zoonoses and outbreak investigations. It will bring into sharp focus the assets of this approach, especially regarding early warning and preparedness for zoonoses, as well as lessons learnt in this implementation through interactive case studies, a keynote talk from Jordan national authorities, followed by a regional countries' sharing experience round table.

In addition, epidemics tend to induce: a wave of media requests for clear and simple answers to public concerns and worries from scientists and public health officials; as well as, concomitantly, an active circulation of fake news. Preparing for an epidemic also means being prepared to have good crisis communication. For these reasons, the program devotes an introductory session to explain what crisis communication is and how to manage it.

Lastly, we take the opportunity of this foreword to warmly thank Jordan for their great welcome and hospitality including all the Jordan committed ministries and authorities, and our partner experts (the Jordan focal point institutions, the Central Public Health Laboratory and the Parasitic and Zoonotic Diseases Department of Ministry of Health, as well as the Animal Wealth Directorate of Ministry of Agriculture, and their experts), without whom all this would not have been possible. In the name of our consortium, a big thank for your valuable support in organising this event.

After 2 years of social restrictions related to COVID-19, it is really our great pleasure to meet you again and to share with you during these 3 days.

We wish you all a fruitful time of intersectoral and regional exchanges.

One Health Approach : early warning & preparedness for zoonoses

As MediLabSecure is a One Health project, a keynote talk will focus on the Jordan One Health experience with two points of view : one from a representative of the Ministry of Health and the other from a National Public Health Laboratory. This keynote will be followed by a round table of Middle East countries sharing their feedback on their One Health experience, with a focus on early warning and preparedness for zoonoses.



During this session, the Nagoya Protocol ground principles will be detailled and followed by an overview of the implementation of such Protocol in each country represented in this meeting. Practical cases focusing on the impact of the Nagoya Protocol on surveillance activities will be presented and more particularly on the collection, use and distribution of samples.








Rola Ghanem

Head of the International Communication of the Department of International Affairs & Pasteur Network International Affairs Institut Pasteur Paris, France





Montpellier, France


Dr Vincent Robert is the Work package leader of the medical entomology working group of the MediLabSecure project. He is Research Director at the French National Research Institute for Sustainable Development, in Montpellier. His speciality is medical entomology and human diseases transmitted by mosquito vectors, with a primary interest in malaria and arboviral diseases. He belonged to the team that, for the first time, demonstrated the huge entomological impacts of pyrethroid impregnated bednets against anopheline mosquitoes and malaria transmission. He published more than 250 articles in international peer-reviewed journals (h=33) and book-chapters, plus two books."




Entomology for Non-Entomologist Training

LOGISTICS : What to do and where to go

As we all enjoy a come-back to the Meetings in a real life setting, this meeting will take place in a nice area at the Mövenpick Dead Sea Resort in Jordan.

In order facilitate the realisation of this meeting, please read the following pages to have more informations about the logistical part of this reunion.





Arrival : Shuttle

Upon your arrival in Jordan, a shuttle will pick you up from the airport and will take you directly to the Mövenpick Resort & Spa Dead Sea, where the accomodation and the meeting will take place.

The driver will be waiting for you at the "Arrival" area of the airport with a sign indicating MediLabSecure.

For the return trip, a shuttle will take you to the airport. Shuttles will be organized depending on the time of your return flight.

Regarding guests that will not be coming via plane, a private bus departure will be organized. This shuttle will arrive directly in front of the Hotel.

Taxi costs for participants not willing to use the hotel shuttle won't be covered by MediLabSecure project and will be supported by the participants.



Some of you may need a Jordanian visa to enter the territory once you land or arrive in Jordan.

For the European nationalities, the visa is required once you land in the Queen Alia airport and will cost around 40 JOD. This visa can only be payed with Jordanian dinars in cash.

Do not forget to get Dinars before the meeting in an exchange bureau.







Breakfast

Every morning, the day will start with a continental breakfast in a buffet style. Starting at 6:00 AM, you are free to take your time to eat until the beginning of the first activity for the day.

Lunches

During the meeting and trainings, lunches will be served at the hotel restaurant. Most days, you will have one hour and half to eat, starting between 12:00 and 12:30. Once again, you will have a great choice of various foods.

Dinners

From the day you arrive and for the duration of the meeting and the trainings, dinners will also be served at the hotel.

Dinners will be served from 6.30pm to 10.30pm.

No allowance for outside meals will be given. If, for any reason you plan to have dinner outside the hotel, please let us know in advance so that we can adapt the number of meals with the hotel.

For those of you who leave on May 19th either in the morning or the afternoon, you will have perdiems in order to eat your lunch or dinner while waiting for your plane.

Cocktail

On Wednesday May 18th , following the closing ceremony, a cocktail will be served at the hotel, between the Beach lounge and the spa, in an outdoor area, from 6.00pm to 8:00pm.

Expenses - Per diems - COVID-19

Free and Extra Expenses

On the time of your arrival at the Queen Alia airport, your living expenses will be taken care of by the MediLabsecure funds. This includes :

- Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner from the 16th to the 19th of May. Most of the meals will be taken in the Hotel. Any meal taken outside of the scheduled hour or the registered restaurant will be at your own expense. The only meal outside of the Hotel that will be taken care of will be upon your arrival and departure, most likely near the airport.
- Once you arrive in the Hotel, you will have a 24/7 access to free Wifi connexion. It is recommended that you use this connexion to communicate, especially to people outside of the country, as the calls from the telephone in your room will be at your own expense.

Per Diem & Reimbursements

In order to be reimbursed for your expenses before and after your presence in the Hotel, you should be keeping receipts in order to receive reimbursements. You will have to fill a document and send it to Overcome, the company that is taking care of a lot of logistical aspects of this meeting. These expenses include :

- Meals taken at the airport
- Travel fees from your personnal home to the airport (Taxi, Bus, Metro, Uber)

COVID-19

As you know, the COVID-19 crisis is still an important issue that must be taken into account while we prepare this meeting. The following measures are greatly recommanded for the safety of everyone.

- Custom-made washable masks will be given to everyone. Wearing them in close confined spaces, such as elevators, meeting rooms and corridors is advised but not enforced.
- Meals and Dinners will be served in a buffet style. We ask you, at those moments of the day, to be cautious and to keep a distance especially while in line.


